


# One potato (2)

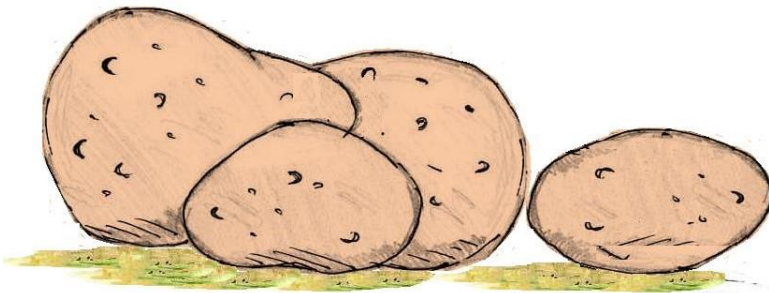
*Moving to the beat, a simple circle game.*

*This is from 'Catch a song' by Deanna Hoermann and Doreen Bridges, published in 1988.*

*Three or four balls or bean bags are passed round the circle to the beat. Any child caught with the ball is 'out' and sits in the middle to help with the singing.*
