

Soon we will be hearing the sound of frogs mating and seeing frog spawn in the ponds and rivers. This song from Turkey '[Küçük kurbağa](#)' (little frog) is incredibly similar to a Swedish circle game I recorded several years ago: [Little frogs - a Swedish circle game - English version - YouTube](#) This has the same tune as a military march from the French Revolution 'Au pas camara' / 'In step comrade' and was mockingly corrupted by the British to 'Au pas grenouilles' / 'In step little frogs'. I would love to know more about its true origin! A well traveled tune as there are also versions in Hungary and Romania.
