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A Halloween hand play for the spooky season.

It can also be used making small finger movements. The first verse is from 'Mother Goose Rhymes & Songs: Early Childhood Education' written by J. R. Shannon many years ago. Set to music and second verse by Dany Rosevear.

Verse 1. Form a triangle above head. Use two fingers to stroke whiskers across face. Circle eyes. Make a funny face and wiggle fingers.

Verse 2. Form a circle with arms in front of tummy. Make 'ooh' sounds and wiggle fingers. Hook thumbs together and, flutter fingers. Throw hands to cheek then form the witches hat!
