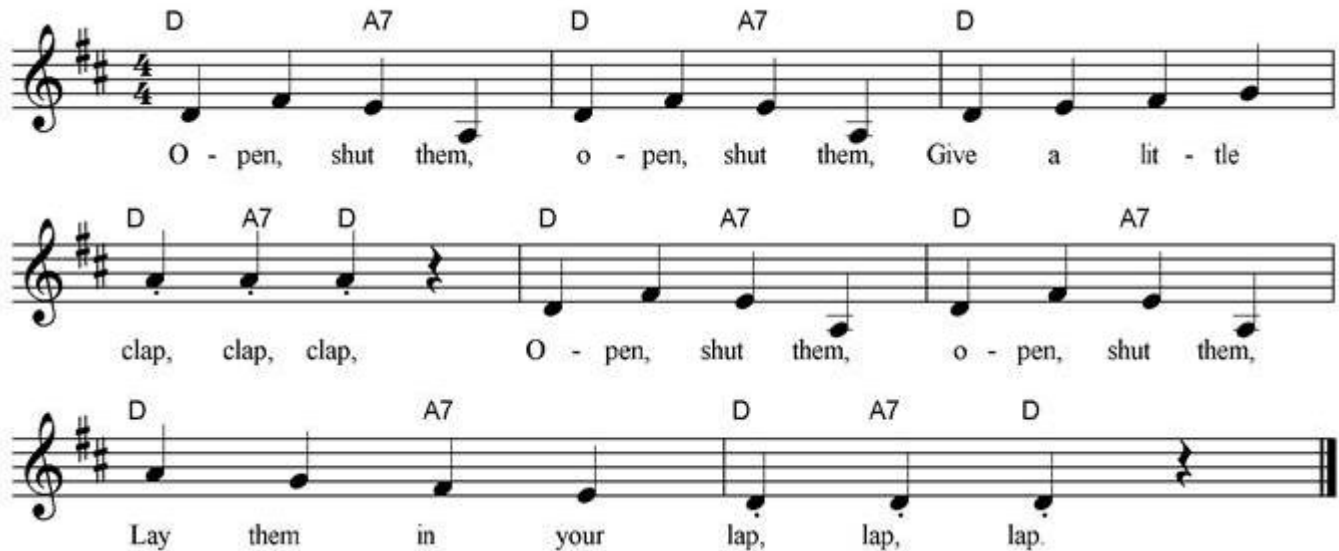


Open, shut them

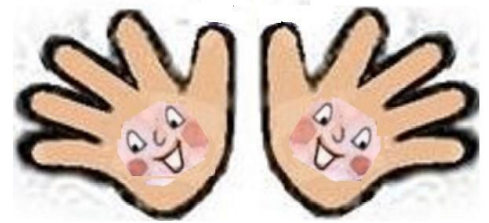
